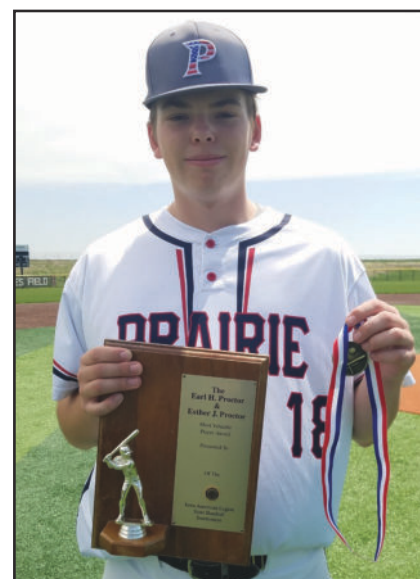

Hello Legion Family,

Our year is ending. I've visited 70+ Posts (that counts drop-ins). If I was traveling through a town and had time, I'd call a Post Commander or anybody I could reach and ask to meet. We usually met at a restaurant or their post canteen. I've attended a dozen District Conferences, numerous county meetings, radio interviews, and TV appearances, and there have been numerous newspaper articles during our travels. We had national visits, the Membership Workshop, Mid-Winter Conference, Spring and Fall meetings, too many Zoom meetings to count, Dept meetings, visits to the capital, 100 yr. celebrations, the Indy race, Welcome Home Soldier Monument with WWII veterans, numerous parades, two bridge dedications, Boys State visit, Jr Auxiliary Camp, Wreaths Across AMERICA, four trips to the Iowa Veterans Home, and visits with County VSOs filled the rest of my time.

My message this year hasn't changed as we promoted the national message, and sometimes our own message. At the top of the list were Buddy Checks/BeTheOne initiative, Pact Act, our National and Dept Legislative Priorities, Voter Voice, Dept Service Office, our E-newsletter, and of course Membership.

I've learned lessons along the way.

Lesson learned: Hundreds of Legion Family members are working hard at our mission. These family members know our mission and accomplishments and are very motivated. They understand the Legion Family message and are willing to go the extra mile to pull us all together. They just won't give up. As motivated as they are, they're still looking for dedicated leadership from their own posts, districts, and departments that are willing to do everything in their power to strengthen our department. If we can pull our current and future leaders together at all levels through communication and mentorship, we'll be on board with those many working on our mission. Knowing our mission and accomplishments will not maintain their motivation. They need help.

Lesson learned: It didn't take long to realize we were getting little bang for our buck in our travels. The best attendance we had for a post-visit was 21. Overall, we averaged a crowd of 8-10. I switched my focus to County meetings. This proved to be a turning point in our visits. I could do much less traveling and reach many more legionnaires at the county level. The audience was much larger, and more posts could hear our message in one visit.

Lesson learned: I'm starting to get the question, "Are you ready for the year to end?" The quick answer is No. I must admit, I've had a good time. This year has pretty much gone as planned. I didn't underestimate the time it was going to take to do the job. I've been busy. I knew there were going to be speed bumps and occasionally a roadblock would pop up now and then. I feel like I was prepared. I knew I would need help at times, and I knew who I could reach out to when help or advice was needed. If somebody told me they'd be there for me, they'd been there. However, I totally underestimated what has come to be our greatest joy. As Gail and traveled around the state, we were always welcomed with open arms. In most cases, we left a visit with a new friend. We left every visit with a sense of accomplishment, and we never

As your Adjutant, much of my job involves answering inquiries about the policies, programs, and positions of The American Legion. I hear both compliments and concerns about what The American Legion is doing, from the Post level to the National level. I sometimes get the feeling that some members do not believe they have a voice in the decisions of our organization.

The members of The American Legion are the organization's "stakeholders." We ALL have a voice in the direction our organization is going. It is the members who control our organization – from the local post to National Headquarters.

I remember back to the first time I was installed as a post officer. During the installation ceremony, the installing officer stated, "Remember there is no rank among us for we all serve as equals." The words have always stuck with me and given me the assurance that my voice in The American Legion is important. As a stakeholder in this organization, every member can participate in the process.

Each member has a voice and vote to determine the direction of the post. Members can run for post offices and serve on post committees. That involvement can continue to the district, department and national levels. How far you take the journey is up to you - but as a member - you need to know the opportunity exists. After all, the National Commander's journey in The American Legion began the same as yours – he signed up to become a member in a local post.

If you have ideas on how to make our organization better, I encourage you to get involved. Our programs are only as good as the volunteers who run them. The positions and policies we adopt are only as good as those who propose them. The American Legion provides every member the opportunity to be involved.

One way for members and posts to get involved is through the resolution process. For The American Legion to take a position on any issue, The American Legion must have a controlling resolution in force establishing such a position.

For information on writing resolutions, visit our website at www.ialegion.org/resolutions or consult your Post Officer's Guide. Each will give you detailed instructions on how to write a resolution.

Once the resolution is written, you must work toward getting The American Legion to adopt it. The first step is to present it for passage by your post at a post meeting. If your post adopts the resolution, it should then be forwarded to department for consideration by the department.

On the department level, there are two bodies which can adopt resolutions as the policy of the organization, the Department Convention and the Department Executive Committee. The Department Convention will be in session July 14-16 in Des Moines and the Department Executive Committee next meets on June 24 in Des Moines.

For a resolution to be considered at this year's Department Convention, it must be received by the Department office no later than June 30. However, I

Don't forget June 2-4 is leadership school if you never attend one it has a lot of very good information for the incoming officers,

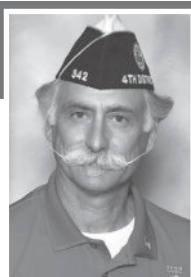

Veteran's Suicidal Crisis

As of January 17, 2023, a new program was issued for those veterans in critical need of

assistance if they have suicidal tendencies. Veterans in acute suicidal crises will be permitted to go to any VA or non-VA healthcare facility for emergency treatment at no cost. This includes inpatient or crisis residential care for up to 30 days. Outpatient care

for up to 90 days. A Veteran does not need to be enrolled in the VA system to utilize this new benefit. This program provides pay for, or reimbursement for treatment of eligible individuals' emergency suicide support, along with transportation costs.

Approximately 9 million Veterans who are not currently enrolled in VA will be able to get help with this program.

Eligible individuals that qualify for this status are as follows: Veterans who were discharged or released from active duty after more than 24 months of active service under conditions other than dishonorable discharge. Reserve members are eligible if they have

In September 2022 the VA released the National Suicide Prevention Annual Report, which showed that Veteran suicides decreased in 2020. This shows with the help of the crisis center that the suicide rate among Veterans has decreased for the 2nd year in a row since 2006.

During Day 1 of The American Legion National Executive Committee's Spring Meetings, the organization's governing body approved a new method for raising awareness of the Legion's "Be the One" veteran suicide-prevention initiative. The NEC passed Resolution 13: Be the One Days. The resolution urges American Legion Family members and American Legion posts to – on the first of each month, starting this June – set aside that day as an opportunity to reduce the stigma around mental health issues. Legion Family members are urged to wear a "Be the One" item to signal their commitment to the initiative.

"We believe it will take a little bit of time to get this off the ground," said American Legion Marketing Commission Chairman Paul Evenson. "But once it spreads widely across the Legion Family, it will be a great way to keep the awareness high about this important issue all year long."

During Evenson's remarks, Kim Meesters – Brand Strategy and Innovation Director in the Legion's Marketing Division – shared the story of a servicemember who approached national staff during an event earlier this year and said he had contemplated suicide, at one time having a weapon in his hand to do so. He was immediately connected with an American Legion service officer.

"Not only did they quickly get him some companionship and some compassion and tell him they would help, but within 24 hours the gentleman had the appointments he needed, the right caretakers to help him (and) he had been connected with a (Legion) post," Meesters said. "How do we measure success with ('Be the One')? We measure it if we save one life. It means all of this is worth it."

As American as Mom, Baseball and Apple Pie By Emily Martin, Vice-Commander, Post #406

In June, Ernie Johnson Legion Post #406 in Stanton, Iowa, will host their 84th Baseball Day. Yes, apple pie will be served (also peach, strawberry rhubarb, berry, and just about any other flavor of fruit pie). And yes – odds are that many moms will be in attendance. For most, the day will begin with the t-ball game at 8 a.m. and continue through the day with games working their way up through the ages. If luck is with them, there will even be a high school game in the evening.

The first Baseball Day in Stanton was in 1939 in celebration of the 100th birthday of baseball. It was presented by "The Double Dozen," a group of local businessmen and veterans. It was successful enough that they repeated the event in 1940 and 1941. By 1942, Stanton was feeling the effects of war. Many of their young men were away serving their country, so Baseball Day was postponed until 1947 when the American Legion (many of whom were members of the original Double Dozen) revitalized the project.

Attendees have the option of purchasing raffle tickets. Nowadays the post gives out cash prizes, but in years past, prizes have included boats (when nearby Viking Lake opened in 1957) and even cars. Stanton Baseball Day was THE event to attend and often featured special guests, such as major leaguers Mickey Owen, catcher for the St. Louis Cardinals, Brooklyn Dodgers, Chicago Cubs, and Boston Red Sox (1948); Bob Cerv, left fielder for the New York Yankees and KC Athletics (1956); Bobby Feller, pitcher for the Cleveland Indians (1961). In 1954, the Kansas City Monarchs, a Negro League team, played the Stanton town team, and, in 1973, The Queen and her Court, a professional softball exhibition team, played the men of the town in an evening game.

For the men and women of Post #406, the event has already begun. Supplies are purchased, volunteers are scheduled and, of course, pies are being baked. Games have mostly been scheduled (and umpires reserved) because the post has an incredible partnership with the director of the Viking Center, a local non-profit wellness center that hosts youth sports.

On the big day – June 10 – members of the post will man the gate, work the grill, and run the concession stand. Although the entertainment will not likely include baton twirlers, Swedish folk dancers, skydivers, or clowns like in previous years, volunteer announcers host baseball trivia throughout the day. Every ball player that day (regardless of team) will get a free sno-cone. Townsfolk will eat their weight in hot dogs, nachos, popcorn, and, of course, pie. At the end of the day, sun-burned spectators will head home with their weary ball players, and the members of Post #406 will be packing up the concession stand and readying themselves for next year's Baseball Day.

Department Color Guard Competition

The Department Color Guard Contest will be held on Saturday, July 15, 2023, at the Department Convention. Rules and entry forms are available on the Department website or by request from Department at 800-365-8387. Each entry form must be certified by the Adjutant of the unit's sponsoring Post or District. The contest entry form must be submitted to the Department before the close of the Color Guard Registration Meeting at the Department Convention. Advance registration is encouraged and may be submitted to: The American Legion of Iowa, Color Guard Competition, 720 Lyon Street, Des Moines, IA 50309. The order of appearance in the contest will be in reverse order of receipt of the entry form with the earliest postmark.

The American Legion Department Color Guard Contest does not limit the number of units allowed to compete in the Contest from any Post, Unit, or Squadron. All color guard members will be required to register for the Department Convention as a delegate, alternates, or guests with The American Legion, American Legion Auxiliary, or Sons of The American Legion.

Educator of the Year

Miss Janaszak has been doing a Veterans Day project with the whole elementary school within our district. All students and staff are welcome to participate. She has been doing this project for going on five years. She hands out a form that the child and/or staff can work on at home. Those that choose to participate get to decorate and put a picture of their family member that is a veteran on the Veteran project paper. They also tell how they are related to that veteran and the branch. She displays this on the whole length of the elementary hallway across from her room. Miss Janaszak adds in her own family members and openly talks about the importance of remembering and honoring our soldiers, past and present. It is so meaningful and popular that the display stays up for at least a month, if not longer. It caught on within the community and our local newspaper did a piece on it.

In the Spring of 2022, Miss Janaszak agreed to join forces with the Auxiliary Post 238 Eugene McManus to help educate our youth about the importance of the poppy and what it stands for. Miss Janaszak decided to take the coloring contest a step further and had each grade level complete a whole project of creating a poppy. Each grade created a poppy flower with a different art technique. Miss Janaszak helped to distribute the certificates and prizes to the first and second-place winners. She later presented Post 238 with a display she created of the first and second-place contest winners to hang in the Legion building.

Miss Janaszak is the daughter of a retired Navy man. He served 20 years and retired while stationed at Pearl Harbor, Hawaii on the USS Cimarron AO-177 in 1998. He was also deployed during Desert Storm. Miss Janaszak has lived in many places but always called Iowa home. Her love to educate the youth about our veterans, past and present, continues to grow the patriotism of our youth. One can see this in these two successful and enjoyable projects at elementary school.



The contest has two competition classes, Military Open Class, and Advancing/Retiring of Colors Class.

Military Open Class - All units must be members of The American Legion and/or Legion Family (i.e., Sons of The American Legion, American Legion Auxiliary, or American Legion mixed participants). If competing for the Commander's Color Guard, all unit members competing in this class must meet all the requirements for full American Legion membership and be over 18 years of age. The unit must be composed of seven (7) members or less including the Commanding Officer.

Advancing/Retiring of Colors Class - All units must be members of The American Legion and/or Legion Family (i.e., Sons of The American Legion, American Legion Auxiliary, or American Legion mixed participants). The unit must be composed of not less than four (4) members. If the color guard consists of only four (4) members, the American Flag bearer will give all color guard commands.

To be considered for the official Department Commander's Champion Color Guard of The American Legion, those units consisting of full Legion members must have competed in Military Open Class.

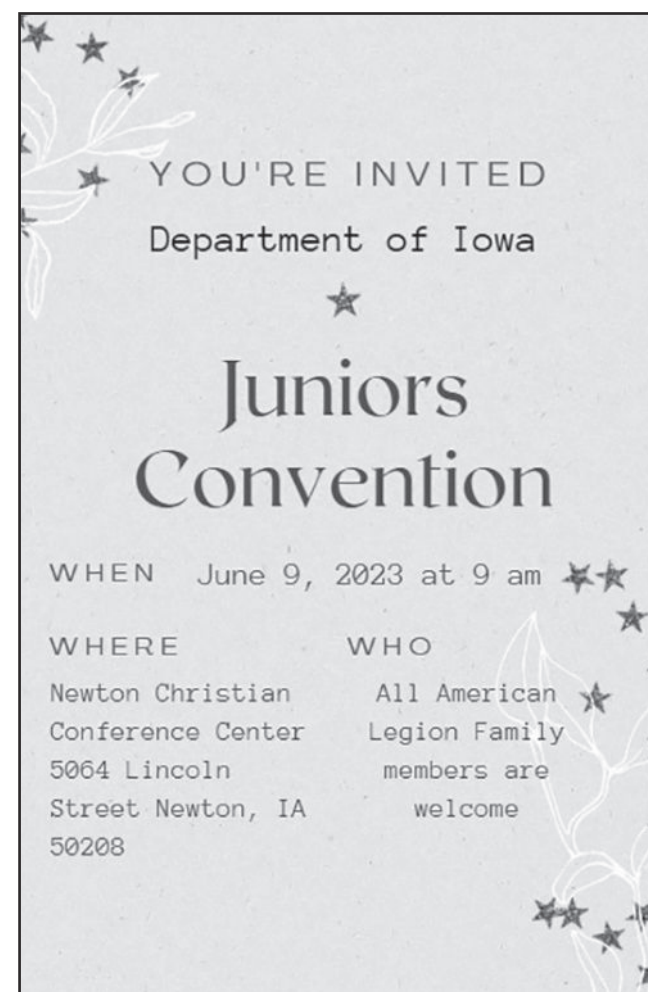

who are struggling in accomplishing their mission? It only takes one person who is excited about being a member! One happy, positive person can influence others to help work on one event. One happy, positive

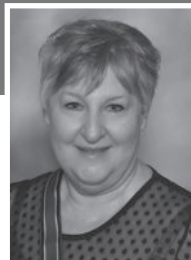

everyone to keep doing what you're doing and more.

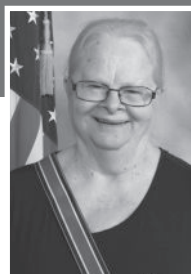

CALL TO THE 102nd ANNUAL DEPARTMENT CONVENTION

The 102nd Annual Department Convention of the American Legion Auxiliary, Department of Iowa will be held Friday, Saturday and Sunday, July 14-16, 2023. All Auxiliary Pre-Convention Meetings, General Sessions and Joint Meetings with The American Legion Family will be held at the Airport Holiday Inn, 6111 Fleur Dr., Des Moines IA.

PURPOSE:

The convention is called for the purpose of electing officers for the ensuing year, amending the Department Constitution, Bylaws, and Standing Rules, receiving reports from Department Officers and Committees, electing delegates and alternates to attend National Convention, receiving reports from members of National Committees, and the transaction of such other business as may be brought before it.

REGISTRATION:

Registration will be Friday, July 14th, from Noon to 2:00 p.m. and 5:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. and Saturday, July 16th, from 8:00 a.m. until 10:00 a.m. Pre-Registration is requested online or by mail and the fee is \$10.00 for all attendees. There is no registration fee for Junior Auxiliary members, but they MUST check in at registration table. Everyone is required to register for the Convention. You must check in at the Auxiliary Registration Table at the Convention.

REPRESENTATION:

Refer to page 5 of the 2022-2023 Department Blue Book, Article IX of the Department Constitution, Sections 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6:

- Section 2. Each Unit shall be entitled to elect one (1) delegate and one (1) alternate, and one (1) additional delegate and one (1) additional alternate for each fifty (50) members or major fraction thereof, provided their current dues have been received by the Department Executive Director by MAY 15th of the current year. No alternate shall be entitled to a vote unless seated as a delegate.
- Section 3. Members of the Department Executive Committee, all Past Department Presidents, District Presidents-elect, and incoming County Presidents, all of whom are in good standing in their local Units, shall be delegates at large to the Department Convention.
- Section 4. Election of officers shall be held according to the Department Standing Rules. No member shall have more than one (1) vote.
- Section 5. The Legislative Body of this Department shall be the delegates to the Department Convention to be held each year not less than two (2) weeks prior to the National Convention.
- Section 6. A quorum of the Department Convention shall consist of fifty percent (50%) of the duly registered delegates.

DELEGATE AND ALTERNATE CREDENTIALS:

A form to list Delegates and Alternates is included in the packet (sent to the Unit President of each Unit by May 31, 2023. CALL FOR THE ONE-HUNDRED AND FOURTH ANNUAL CONVENTION THE AMERICAN LEGION, DEPARTMENT OF IOWA

The One-Hundred and Fourth Annual Convention of The American Legion, Department of Iowa, will be held in Des Moines, Iowa, July 14, 15, & 16, 2023. The Convention will be called to order at 4:00 p.m., Friday, July 14, in Ballroom Central and South of the Holiday Inn Airport Conference Center in Des Moines, Iowa.

PURPOSE

The Convention is called for the purpose of:

1. Electing Department Officers for the ensuing year;
2. Ratification of Constitution and Bylaws;
3. Selecting the place of holding the One Hundred and Sixth Annual Department Convention;
4. Selecting delegates and alternates to the One-Hundred and Third Annual National Convention; and
5. For the transaction of such other business as may be brought before the Convention.

REPRESENTATION

Representation will be by Post. Each Post is entitled to two delegates and two alternates, provided it has at least 15 paid up members by 4:00 p.m. June 14, 2023. Each Post is also entitled to one delegate and one alternate for each additional 50 paid up members or a major fraction thereof, whose dues have been paid on or before 4:00 p.m. June 14, 2023.

The vote of each Post will be equal to the total number of delegates to which it is entitled.

All Past Department Commanders of the Iowa Department of The American Legion, who are members in good standing in any Post in the Department, present and in attendance at the Department Convention, shall be entitled to all the privileges of a delegate to said convention, and entitled to a vote therein.

SELECTION OF DELEGATES

All Post delegates and alternates to the Convention will be selected at a regular meeting of the Post, or a special meeting called for that purpose.

Post Adjutants should give notice in writing to each member of the Post of the date, time, purpose, and place of such meeting, and the number of delegates to which it is entitled in the Convention.

Alternates have power to vote only in the absence of delegates, but have all other privileges of delegates.

Delegates should be chosen with care as they have the voting power of the Post on all questions brought before the Convention.

EXPENSES OF DELEGATES AND ALTERNATES

Expenses of delegates and alternates who attend as Post representatives must be paid by their Post or by themselves, as no authority exists for the Department to pay the expenses of any delegate to the Convention.

Each delegation may have as its guests such members of The American Legion and their families as it sees fit to invite to accompany it. Insofar as space will permit, they will be admitted to the Convention Hall.

Press representatives accompanying delegations will be accorded every facility for their work at the Convention. They should report to the Department Headquarters office upon arrival.

DEPARTMENT HEADQUARTERS

Department Headquarters will be in Room 298 of the Airport Holiday Inn, Des Moines, Iowa. Regular and routine correspondence should be sent as usual to the Department Headquarters, 720 Lyon St., Des Moines, Iowa 50309.

REGISTRATION AND HOUSING

Delegates, alternates and guests attending the Convention must register. **A \$20.00 registration fee will be collected from all delegates, alternates, and guests at registration.**

Delegates, alternates and guests attending the Convention should address all inquiries relative to hotel reservations directly with the designated convention hotel(s).

CREDENTIALS FOR DELEGATES AND ALTERNATES

Credentials for delegates and alternates based upon the number to which each Post is entitled will be given at registration. All delegates, alternates and guests will be required to wear their badge in order to gain admittance into the Convention Hall.

OFFICIALS

Present Department and Post Officers, members of the Department Executive Committee, except Past Department Commanders, Officers of District and County organizations, unless selected as delegates and alternates to the Convention by their Post, have no privileges in the Convention except as guests of their respective delegations.

It is suggested that these officials be made members of the official Post delegation, as their experience will be exceedingly valuable to the delegation.

RESOLUTIONS

Any Post or accredited delegate to the Convention may submit resolutions embodying constructive suggestions for the welfare of The American Legion. They should be in duplicate, typewritten, and shall be turned into the Department Adjutant **on or before June 30, 2023**, in order that he may refer them to the Resolutions Assignment Committee. A Resolution form with instructions is enclosed. More can be obtained by contacting the Department Adjutant.
